The US Department of Justice to launch official review of the 1921 Tulsa Race Massacre

After more than 100 years of silence from the federal government, the US Department of Justice (“DOJ”) will launch an official review of the Tulsa Race Massacre and make an accounting of those fateful two days in 1921.
